

Student Mobility in Saint Louis: Technical Brief

Overview

The purpose of this brief is to report all initial quantitative findings from building-level student mobility data in St. Louis City and its surrounding counties (St. Louis County, St. Charles, Jefferson, and Franklin Counties), and three other Missouri metropolitan areas: Kansas City, Springfield, and Columbia. The Saint Louis Research Practice Collaborative (SRPC) conducted this preliminary work as part of a larger, ongoing project to better understand the systematic causes and effects of student mobility in the city. Further research will include de-identified student-level data, which will give greater nuance and applicability to individual student movement and comparisons across non-Missouri schools.

Methods

To understand the nature of student mobility patterns in St. Louis, the SRPC evaluated yearly building-level data from the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (MODESE). DESE has reported student mobility information from the 2009-2010 school year to the most recent reported school year of 2021-2022¹. Preliminary analysis centers around data from 2019, the last year before COVID-19, as its long term effects are not yet fully understood. When looking at longitudinal trends for mobility data from 2010-2022, we can conclude that elevated student mobility rates have been par for the course for St. Louis City for quite some time; while transfer rates do decline sharply during the pandemic, it is still an ongoing issue which will likely return as schools increasingly return to in-person instruction.

Only approximately half of US states track student turnover, and even fewer track or report building-level data. Because of the variation across legislatures in collecting, cleaning, and reporting data, we centered our preliminary analysis on information provided by MODESE. This is because, given the variance in fall count cutoff dates, definitions and timelines of transferring into and out of a school, and unclear rules to address duplicate counting, it was easier to compare within MODESE's purview, as it is an internally consistent dataset with known rules, even if not directly applicable or comparable to other states.

Enrollment, mobility, and school directory data was downloaded from the MODESE website, and transfer instance rates were obtained through an informal data request. Variable definitions for mobility, which are documented below, were confirmed with DESE as documentation is not currently publicly available.

The DESE 2022 school directory was used to determine which schools fall within city or county lines. Schools were first filtered by the reported county or city within DESE; this appears to be a self-reported metric. Afterwards, for cities, schools in suburbs outside of city limits were manually removed. The most recent school directory includes schools which have closed prior to 2022. Therefore, it is an adequate working directory of all Missouri schools.

Because of FERPA, small numbers of students run the risk of being easily identifiable and are subject to suppression. In other states, suppression, often reporting a range instead of exact values, appears to be relatively common. However, there does not appear to be any suppression in transfer and mobility data; sometimes, only one (1) transfer was reported for a school. Some schools had NULL transfer data. Because there was no indication of suppression, NULL was assumed to be a value of zero in order to perform calculations uniformly across the dataset. At most, given the extreme infrequency of this designation, this may result in a slight underestimate of true MO mobility rates.

Finally, some schools were removed by nature of their specialization. For example, in St. Louis, the juvenile detention center, the inpatient center at the hospital, and schools for the disabled were removed. This is because, given their specialized student groups, mobility is likely to be governed by factors not within the purview of the existing study.² A full list of schools included in each geographic region can be found in the appendix below.

¹Henceforth, school years will be referred to by the year in which it ends; e.g., the 2021-2022 school year will be referred to as "2022" data.

Preliminary analysis within a school year was performed using bivariate ordinary least square means regression analysis, without removing any notable statistical outliers. This was done to understand the general nature of the relationship between pairwise variables, and not to find an explanatory set of variables to explain student mobility behaviors.

Further research on student-level data, and qualitative factors for student transfer decision-making, is needed to refine the model and understand variable interactions more precisely in future publications.

Definitions

Transfers

Number of students at a school which have experienced some form of mobility (transferring into or out of the school) during that year.³

Fall Enrollment

Number of students enrolled at a school by the fall count date (in MO, the last Wednesday in September).

Additional Enrollment

Number of students who have transferred into a school after the fall count date.

DESE Mobility Rate / School Building Mobility Rate

Transfers / (Fall Enrollment + Additional Enrollment)

Attendance Rate

The proportion of all enrolled students who attend school at least 90% of the time.


Teacher Experience

The average years of experience of all teachers within a school.


³When a student transfers into a school, a new record is created, even if they previously transferred out of the same school. Thus, there is a possibility of some double-counting.

In 2019, STL City schools had a median transfer rate of 37%. This means that for half of all city schools, more than a third of the total enrolled students experienced some mobility in that school year.



Table 2 displays the statistical significance of variance in mobility rates as a function of place in 2019. For all surrounding counties and selected cities, the difference is statistically significant ($p < 0.05$ or lower). Thus, despite the overlap in ranges for student mobility rates across comparable MO counties and cities, St. Louis City has an unusually high mobility rate, indicating that some factors in the city differ from elsewhere in the state.


Mobility Rates, Longitudinal


Change in time of median School Building Mobility Rate in MO Cities

St. Louis City and Kansas City show visible decline in mobility rates between 2010 and 2019. Because it is possible that the effects of COVID-19 had some effect on mobility, further research is required to understand the change in mobility rates beyond 2019.



In 2019, there is some correlation between attendance rates of students and mobility rate in a school. Of course, mobility is not a one-dimensional problem, and a single variable cannot explain the majority of the variance. However, these numbers suggest that there is some non-zero relationship between attendance and mobility rate on the building level.

Attendance, 2021




In 2021, while the relationship between mobility and attendance is still statistically significant, the model explains much less of the variance compared to 2019 (R^2 is much lower). This is likely because COVID-19 has affected not only both attendance rates and attendance criteria at schools, but also mobility rates between schools. It is possible that COVID-19 mechanisms have affected both variables in similar ways; it may take years to understand the comparative effects of COVID-19 on student mobility.

Attendance, 2022



In 2022, the relationship between attendance and mobility appears more similar to pre-pandemic levels; the association is stronger and remains statistically significant. Thus, it is possible that the effects of COVID-19 only caused a temporary decline in mobility rates; further investigation is necessary to draw firm conclusions.

Teacher Experience, 2019



Teacher Experience, 2021




Teacher Experience, 2022



In 2019, 2021, and 2022, there is no statistically significant relationship between average years of teacher experience and student mobility rates ($p > 0.05$, $R^2 < 0.05$). This could be for several reasons. First, teacher experience simply may not correlate with student transfer decisions. Alternatively, teaching quality and teacher experience may not be as closely linked as is traditionally thought. Finally, it is possible there

are confounding variables: for example, teaching experience may have different, significant effects in different grades of school. Future qualitative data will inform the analysis of the true relationship between teacher experience and mobility.

Conclusion

This work is in the beginning stages of a long, robust study of student enrollment patterns, its causes, and effects. While bivariate analysis can provide initial understandings of pairwise relationships between variables, multivariate regression would allow variables to be controlled to illuminate possible trends and associations within more statistically similar schools. For example, magnet and specialized arts schools will likely behave differently than neighborhood schools. Further analysis is needed to understand whether variables are linked and amplify their effects on mobility.

Currently, the SRPC has access to building-level data on student movement trends. Unfortunately, this does pose some limitations to the preliminary analysis: since students are not tracked, particularly mobile students may be double-counted in figures. The SRPC is in the process of obtaining de-identified student-level longitudinal data to better understand the dynamics of movement in city schools and determine whether these elevated mobility levels are due to and a result of unique factors for this city. Student mobility definitions vary widely across states, and the problem is conceptualized differently. As such, availability of comparison data was extremely limited. Future research will provide greater insight into how St. Louis City's schools compare to others.
